# Victoria Park High takes to stage

**THE** Victoria Park High School takes to the stage to present Andrew Lloyd Webber's *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat*.

The opening night takes place on Wednesday, May 11 and the show runs until Saturday, May 14. The production will be staged in Victoria Park's David Blake Hall and promises to be yet another proud notch in the belt of the school's prestigious music and drama resumé.

Victoria Park High School holds in excess of 16 Showtime awards, that include two Best Show awards for the school's previous productions of *District Six* and *Copacabana*. *District Six* also earned the school the re-

vered Box Office Hit of the Year award.

Joseph is the debut directorship for Wicus Jansen van Rensburg from the school's music department. Jansen Van Rensburg is no stranger to the stage and has earned himself a number of noteworthy titles and achievements throughout his musical career.

Jansen van Rensburg – better known by his stage name Will Jensen – and who is a music graduate from NMMU, is part of the Centrestage All Star Band and the boyband, Escape. He has further earned himself two Showtime awards for Theatrical Creativity, and is a two-time semi-finalist in the Crescendo singer-songwriter competition.

Janse van Rensburg will take the lead not only from the director's chair but also takes on the role of Joseph in the production.

On stage, a talented cast of learners and teachers, will take on Webber's musical and promises to entertain audiences with the highest level of creative talent, synonymous with Victoria Park's theatrical and musical repertoire.
